FUNDING

Unfortunately, there is not a lot of shortterm money or quick access money available to students. Therefore, it is important to start dealing with any potential financial problem as early as possible, before you run out.

The University has a few support schemes for students in financial hardship. Guidance is provided at <u>https://www2.mmu.ac.uk/student-life/finance/</u> <u>support/support-funds</u>. We have some information about the two main, year round funds below.

DAY TO DAY SUPPORT SCHEME

This is the fund for helping to deal with long term financial hardship. It is intended to help top up the other support you are receiving - it is not intended to be your main source of income. It looks at the difference between your income and your expenditure over the whole academic year and tries to help plug any gap. Because it is looking at a more long-term solution, it does take longer to process and expects some evidence to support your claim. If you receive an award, you will not be expected to pay this back

WHEN TO APPLY

Apply to the Day to Day Support Scheme as soon as you realise that your money will not stretch far enough. Do not wait until you are down to your last fiver, as applications can take at least four weeks to process. Our tip is to apply early for funding – the sooner the better! If you're the sort of person who leaves everything until the last minute, make sure you don't miss the closing date because late applications will not be considered.

Deadlines will be available on the Day to Day Support Scheme website via <u>https://</u> www2.mmu.ac.uk/student-life/finance/ support/support-funds/. We encourage you to apply early as the fund is limited and may run out before the closing date.

CRISIS SUPPORT FUND

This is a quicker fund to apply for but will only provide a fixed weekly amount for a limited amount of time. It is intended to help with subsistence costs while you are waiting for a Day to Day Support Scheme claim to be assessed (or similar). You are not expected to pay this back and some or all of the support may come in the form of supermarket vouchers.

SUPPORT FOR NHS STUDENTS

Students studying Nursing and other NHS courses may be able to apply for additional support through the NHS Learning Support Fund. This includes additional support if you have a child and an "Exceptional Support Fund" if you are still struggling after the University's support scheme has assessed you. WELFARE BENEFITS

Most full-time students will not qualify for welfare benefits for the whole of their course, including summer vacations. There are exceptions to this rule and you should get advice about your entitlement if you:

- + Have children
- + Are sick or disabled
- + Are under 19 and taking an Art Foundation course
- + Are over pension age.

You may qualify for benefits when you have finished one course and are waiting to enrol on another.

FUND-Raising

You may be able to apply for extra help from educational trusts and charities. This can be a time consuming and slow process, but a number of students have achieved successful outcomes. Charities and trusts will often only help specific groups. For example, they may be restricted to helping students on certain courses, above or below a certain age, from particular parts of Britain, or in defined occupations or professions.

HOW TO APPLY TO A Charity or trust

The first stage is to check the website for the instructions or to contact the trust or charity giving brief details of your situation. If you fit their criteria then the organisation will usually send you their own application form.

You may need to write a letter explaining why you are applying. You should include:

- + Title of your course
- + University start date and what year you're currently in
- + Age
- + Place of birth
- + Brief details of your previous study
- + Explanation of your financial difficulty and why you are applying
- + Estimated financial requirements
- + How your studies would benefit yourself or others
- + Any information about why you are appropriate for that trust fund.

Awards are often quite small (around £300 - £500) and charities generally make one-off payments.

WHERE TO LOOK FOR FUNDING

POSTGRADUATE SEARCH

You can search for scholarships and funding that you might be eligible for in the Scholarship Search database. There are £250 million worth of scholarships and postgraduate courses grants available to students annually. This can be used for courses and can be used by UK, EU and international students.

TURN2US

This website has details for hundreds of grant-giving charities that may be able to provide financial support. Not all the charities are just for students, most of them are based on your personal situation (e.g. if you have a disability or if you have children). If you do an advanced search you can find the charities that best match your circumstances. Turn2us can be used by undergraduates, postgraduates and UK, EU and international students.

MYNSHULL'S EDUCATION FOUNDATION

Grants are made to students up to the age of 25 for educational purposes, such as equipment, textbooks and one-off travelling expenses. The areas covered by this fund are the city of Manchester and the adjoining districts. The Trust does not make grants to postgraduate students.

STUDENT DISABILITY ASSISTANCE FUND

This Fund helps students with disabilities to keep up with their studies. The maximum amount of each award is £500 and students must be involved in higher education on a full-time or nearly full-time basis. Students must apply for the Disabled Students' Allowance before applying to the Fund.

GILCHRIST EDUCATION TRUST

Applications are considered from students who have made proper provision to fund a degree or higher education course but find they are facing unexpected financial difficulties that may prevent them from completing it. For example students who are required, as part of their course, to spend a short period studying abroad may be eligible.

Applicants must have lived or attended school in the relevant area and the trust can provide assistance for any purpose that promotes the education, training and development of the applicant.

THE TALENTED ATHLETE SCHOLARSHIP SCHEME (TASS)

TASS is a partnership between National Governing Bodies of Sport and Educational Institutions designed to help athletes in higher and further education. The programme has been created to help students fulfil their sporting potential by maintaining a sensible balance between academic life whilst training and competing as a performance athlete. Scholarships are up to £3,500. You should speak with your governing body to establish whether they are willing to nominate you for an award.

STUDENT SUPPORT PACKAGE

If you have a household income under £25,000, you can apply for the Student Support Package. This should be automatically awarded as long as you have not opted out of sharing information from Student Finance England with the university. If you are in Manchester Met Accommodation, this should automatically come off your Halls fees. Otherwise it will be paid onto your MetCard.
