Responsible for: Supporting the Diversity & Inclusion Student Ambassador project within your allocated faculty, including managing and coordinating student volunteers on student-led activity.

Overall purpose of the Job:

The Diversity & Inclusion Student Ambassador Project aims to increase the success of specific groups of students at Manchester Metropolitan University. Ambassadors will work in partnership with students to understand the challenges faced by specific student communities, and to co-create and deliver activities to reduce the impact of these challenges, with a view to improving the academic and graduate outcomes and student experience for students in the target groups.

Main activities/tasks:

- Attend training to understand the wider context of the project, the role and its importance
- Act as a point of contact in your faculty for target students
- Develop and maintain contacts with staff within your faculty relating to this project, such as Academics, Student Support Staff and Careers Advisers
- Attend regular meetups with a team of ambassadors (at least once a month) to share experiences and ideas, as well as to develop skills and networks
- Be available for delivery of specific activity during key periods e.g. Welcome Week, and to participate in other relevant events within your Faculty
- Proactively engage with students from the target groups to understand their needs and experiences of university, providing 'safe spaces' to allow students to openly voice their concerns
- Engage and organise a team of interested student volunteers to identify, develop and coordinate the delivery of student-led activities and events to improve attainment and student experience
- Take part in other related activities, such as promoting existing opportunities to students, and liaising with university staff to align activities with the project's wider objectives
- Support project communications where relevant, e.g. writing blogs and developing social media content
- Contribute to the safe management of activities, using risk assessments and other project

processes

The post holder shall:

- Attend meetings and training events as required.
- Comply with Union policies, procedures and constitution at all times. /
- Comply with Environmental Legislation and both support and promote measures introduced within the Union to lessen environmental impact.
- Contribute to the positive and professional image of the Union and not act in such a manner as to bring the Union into disrepute.
- Undertake any other duties appropriate for the grade and responsibilities of the post that may from time to time be reasonably requested.
- Have a flexible approach to duties and work and, in particular, adopt a team work style with departments and activities across the Union. This may involve undertaking duties in support of the activities and services of other departments.
- Understand and uphold the mission, vision and values of the organisation and be always guided by them in the course of work.

Other features of the Job (including working conditions, etc.):

Flexible hours – this will depend on your level of engagement with the project, the number of activities you take part in as well as how much time you are able to commit. Certain times of year will be busier than others e.g. Welcome Week, however, on average we expect each ambassador will work approximately 2-3 hours per week.
