PROMOTE

-Create a calendar on union website where societies can submit their events to be featured. Ensure societies are aware of this in committee training and reminded in council meetings to make use of it. Make a separate page containing information for societies' weekly socials.

-Record minutes from council meetings and send them to committee members: ensures nothing is forgotten or missed. Potentially include society members on this list if individuals request to be.

UNITE AND SUPPORT

Encourage unity between societies, encourage working together to make interesting socials collabing or even simply watching other societies' events, creating more exciting and varied opportunities for members that are simple to plan and could potentially gain members. Include Crewe campus in these plans through Project Cheshire.

Work with other officers to help improve issues affecting societies such as supporting members through mental health issues, decrease last-minute room changes, and look at bringing Metcard money in at the start of term when most students need it.

CREATE AND DEVELOP

Change Societies Sunday to a monthly date societies agree on (rename as Society Showcase/ Society Spotlight) and encourage it in society council: committees could host it as one of their regular socials, and could use the event to collaborate with other societies.

Introduce another regular student night at the union in collaboration with the Rock Society, to create a student night for people with an alternative music taste.

Introduce a probation period for committee to ensure the society remains a safe space: review every few months through subgroup to ensure vulnerable members are protected and committee are supported and working efficiently, including feedback from members.
